Shift aims to transform the mind-set of young individuals ages 14 – 18 years in high schools in order to reduce cyber-crime through awareness campaign and to empower cyber crime ex-convicts, ages 18 - 35 years with new media technology, to enable ex-convicts to use their skills in a positive way for livelihood. This will also reduce the high rate of re-offending in our communities and society at large.

Shift joins the world to celebrate Safer Internet Day 2015

On the 10th February, 2015 Shift Initiative joins the world to celebrate Safer Internet Day 2015, the event is a yearly one celebrated every second week of the second month of the year. The program was done at Aunty Ayo International School in Lagos State Nigeria, the objective of the program is to sensitize teenagers on the use of internet, the dangers of internet, cyber bullying, the risk and implications of getting involved in cyber crime and how they can protect themselves from being a victim. The students were addressed by an officer from the Eco-

nomics and Financial Crime Commission (EFCC). Pictures of cyber crime offenders in their custody were also shown around to deter them from harbouring any notion of going into it.

A pupil of the school, Ibukunoluwa Awobo, who spoke on the benefits of the programme, said: "I learnt that cyber bullying is not good, I also learnt about the consequences of getting involved in cyber crime and how people have been jailed as a result of it." Another participant, Princess Nwawodu, felt cyber criminals should be punished first and thereafter given orientation on the

positive ways of applying the internet. The Safer Internet Day was proudly supported by Google Nigeria with promotional items.
